The first thing Daniel did was to describe the dream exactly. "You saw a great image of a huge statue, O King. Its form was awesome!"



"The statue's head was made of gold," Daniel continued.





"Its legs were made of iron, its feet partly of iron, partly of clay."





After describing the statue to the king, Daniel told him the rest of the dream.





The king was amazed. That was exactly what he had dreamed! How could Daniel know that?





Only because God told Daniel. Then Daniel began to tell King Nebuchadnezzar what the dream meant.





"The God of heaven has given you a kingdom, power, strength and glory," Daniel told the king.





"You are that head of gold."





Daniel told the king his golden kingdom would end. The silver part of the statue meant that a weaker kingdom would take its place.





The bronze meant yet another kingdom. And the iron and clay stood for a fourth kingdom.




